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Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Vestaburg Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. In the past the state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no status label is given. Vestaburg Elementary has not been identified as any of these statuses.

Status of School Improvement Plan: District and School Improvement Plans have been submitted and approved annually.

Status of Core Curriculum: All curricula are aligned with the Michigan Core Curriculum and are available on the district web site in Curriculum Crafter. In addition, district personnel are engaged in transitioning to the Common Core state Standards for English Language Arts, Mathematics and Literacy Standards for Social Studies, Science and Technical Subjects and to the Next Generation Science Standards for science. Curriculum review / development process at VES is ongoing, collaborative, and focused on both horizontal and vertical K-12 alignment to insure student achievement of content and process standards.

N.W.E.A: Assessment Program

Vestaburg Community Schools implements the use of the NWEA Assessments to measure student growth. It is the goal for every VCS student to make a minimum of 1 year of academic growth and through the use of these assessments this can now be measured. Students will take assessments in math, reading, literacy, and science three (3) times a year to measure their progress. Teachers will then use this to improve both the group and the individual student instruction.
